As a follow-up to my voicemail in which I told you how I was very happy with the service provided at Abington Library, I will summarize the same thoughts in this e-mail.

I am a 54-year-old man from Staten Island

NY. I grew up in the 60's learning that the Library was a "quiet place" where you could magically take out any book you want at no cost. It was the time when Captain Kangaroo was reading us "The 500 Hats

of Bartholomew Cubbins" on TV.

Since my days growing up within the New York Public Library system and then as a library page in the Great Kills Public Library from age 15 through 21, since my days being a circulation clerk at the City College of New York Library, I have most respected those libraries that honored silence and books.

Your library does both. There is such a diversity of material in this library and such a quiet and respectful atmosphere is sustained here that I feel at once welcomed and slightly awe-inspired, just like my days as a child and teenager in New York.

I know the Montgomery County Library system to a fair degree. My card is from the North Wales Library. I have frequented the Wissahickon Library on Skippack Pike and the Upper Dublin Library, have visited the Lansdale Library at times, have been to Norristown's Central Library and others. Each of them has its own strength and uniqueness, but your library is where I go for "peace and quiet", for re-organization of my mind and soul, and for access to the "new" and the "time-honored".

It's not that I feel like this is a place of worship. I have my own church for that!

But The Abington Free Library does so well at sticking to the knitting of what libraries should be about: Access to information in many varieties and forms in a respectful place where people can gather and speak quietly with one another, where public events are placed on bulletin boards, where free newspapers and handouts are available in the outer room, where there are Learning Courses, a Computer Center, an real information desk with informed librarians, where there is access for someone from the public, like myself, to use this computer to type this e-mail at no charge!


