Adult Literacy helps over a hundred students improve their reading, writing and math skills. We also help adults prepare for their high school equivalency diploma, the GED, and other tests. Those whose native language is not English benefit from our services, too. In addition to individual tutoring sessions, they can attend classes of Conversation Please! on Monday

nights and Tuesday mornings, and Idioms and Grammar on Tuesday afternoons.

We will offer training for new tutors in the fall (most likely in October). Support meetings for all tutors are offered once a month, along with weekly scheduled training opportunities in the area.

on to a more sophisticated volunteer role - shelving children's materials.

Kristen became interested in shelving at age 11 when her mother, Karen, started working as a page in the Children's Department. Initially she shadowed while Karen shelved, eager to learn what her mom was doing. In time Karen let Kristen try her hand at it, providing expert guidance at every turn. Kristen has since become a shelving dynamo, putting in 249.75 service hours last school year, and more than 263 so far this school year in her quest to earn the President's Gold Volunteer Service Award. She is now one of the department's most dependable and productive volunteers.

"I really like volunteering at the library," Kristen says, adding that shelving is a great way to discover new books. An excellent student and avid reader, Kristen's favorite author is Lincoln Peirce, creator of the popular Big Nate series, although she also likes horror, adventure, fantasy, science fiction, graphic novels, in short – "everything."

Currently a seventh-grader at Abington Junior High School, Kristen participates in tennis, track and the Art Club there. She also plays in the AJHS band, having studied clarinet since fourth grade, and likes to swim in her backyard pool. At home she looks after her family's two Maltese terriers, KC (age 6) and Katie (age 16), often watching TV with KC by her side. Kristen also enjoys playing video games, drawing and listening to music on her iPod. She is a "huge fan" of boy band Big Time Rush, whose September 2011 show was the first concert she had ever attended.

Kristen's cheerful personality is reflected in her favorite color (pink), and in her frequent inclusion of smiley faces in her artwork, handwriting and clothing. Describing herself as "full of laughter," Kristen loves helping people, especially "little kids." What would she tell others looking to volunteer at the library? Do it because you want to, and "be responsible and respectful." Kristen has shown herself to be that and much, much more.
